### GERMAN FEST

Tickets for the 38th annual Klein German Festival, scheduled for February 27, 2009, at Klein Collins High School, will go on sale at every school in the Klein district, Klein administration buildings, and at Trinity Lutheran Church, starting Monday, February 9, 2009. ### **TAKS TEST FOR GRADE 3, 4 AND 5 ON MARCH 3RD**

Third, fourth and fifth grade students will be taking a TAKS test on Tuesday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>. ### **SCHOOL TARDIES**

Arriving at school prior to the start of school is important for your child to have a productive day of learning. Your assistance is needed to have your child at school by 8:10 a.m. every morning. The tardy bell rings at 8:20 a.m., this is the time all students are to be in their classrooms ready for learning. Morning arrival time for students is from 7:45 a.m. until 8:10 a.m.

Students who are tardy to school an excessive number of times will have their conduct grade lowered by one letter. This will impact awards given each reporting period.
