Krimmel Parents and Students,

This handbook is intended to provide you with essential information about the use of student Tablet PCs at Krimmel Intermediate School. This year will be filled with exciting learning opportunities that incorporate the use of technology in the classroom and at home.

Please read the following important guidelines in this handbook. It is important that parents/guardians and students understand and abide by the policies and procedures set forth in this handbook.

The following conditions are a summary of some of the most important concepts outlined in this handbook.

- Accidental Damage and Protection Coverage is recommended and can be purchased for \$70.00 per year.
- An annual \$200 Tablet PC Security Deposit is required for all students whose parent/guardian chooses not to purchase the Accidental Damage and Protection Coverage.
- Klein ISD Tablet PCs that are not returned when students leave for the summer or check out of school will be considered stolen. Theft charges will be filed.
- Internet content is filtered on all Klein ISD computers. Internet content will be filtered both at home and at school.
- Parents are ultimately responsible for all activities involving the Klein ISD Tablet PC while the student is off campus.
- There are fines associated with damaging the Tablet PC when a family chooses not to purchase the **Accidental Damage and Protection Coverage** and in other instances outlined in this handbook. These fines are listed in the Tablet PC Handbook.

Please read this handbook carefully. The agreement form at the back of this document is a copy of what you and your child will sign upon receiving the Tablet PC.



Krimmel Core Concepts

Krimmel has been designed around two core concepts. The first is the implementation of a wireless network that supports a 1-to-1 computing environment as part of the district wide technology roll-out. This means that all faculty and students are issued a Tablet PC. The Tablet PC is a laptop computer with the capability of rotating the screen and converting the laptop into a writing tablet. Students at the Vistas High School Program successfully utilized Tablet PC technology during the 2006-2007 school year. Krimmel is the first intermediate school in Klein to incorporate this technology. Students will be given the Tablet PC within the first 3 weeks of school. Mandatory student/parent meetings will be organized and all the details will be covered about the Tablet PCs at that time. This is a major change in the delivery of instruction, the way we use assessments and how our students are involved in instruction. Klein ISD is committed to preparing our students for the realities of the global 21st century. Working in a digital environment with project based outcomes is essential.

The second core concept that Krimmel implements is the utilization of Professional Learning Communities (PLC) in every grade. Learning communities are made up of a core group of academic teachers who work together, plan together and provide a unique learning opportunity for intermediate school students. At Krimmel, a PLC will consist of a Language Arts, Math, Science and Social Studies teacher. This team will have the same group of students who rotate through these teachers. The teachers will provide a common road map for students assigned to their team. The goal of the PLC is to help students stay organized and focused on learning objectives. The PLC teachers utilize common procedures to help students succeed. This group of teachers is committed to working together to help students be the best they can be. This safety net helps our students achieve their goals. The teachers plan together instructionally as they work to weave interdisciplinary learning throughout each academic discipline. The PLC team will continue to meet within their instructional departments reviewing the TEKS and planning ways to best assure that every student succeeds.

Klein ISD Acceptable Use Procedures (cont.)

Procedure: All web pages must conform to school procedure and board procedure.

Disclaimer of Liability: The district shall not be liable for users' inappropriate use of electronic communication resources or violation of copyright restrictions, users' mistakes or negligence, or costs incurred by users. The district shall not be responsible for ensuring the accuracy or usability of any information found on the Internet.

Web Publishing Specifications

Proper Citation: When using an externally produced graphic or text file, campus and district authors must give credit at the bottom of the web page indicating original producer with a notation regarding how and when permission was granted. The URL (web address) should also be included whenever possible.

Copyright Permissions: Do not assume any media published on the Internet is free to use if it does not display copyright information. Written permission to use such graphics, photographs, original writing, and artwork must be received from the creator and kept on file.

Publishing Student Work and/or Photograph: Prior to publication, teachers and administrators must verify that no parent letter is on file prohibiting publication of student work or photographs on the Internet.

Accuracy: Prior to publication, all web pages must first be spell-checked and proofread for content and grammar and copyright compliance.

Ownership: Materials published on the district or all campus home pages become the property of the school district if they were developed during school hours or on district computers. Materials published on the district home page that were developed, displayed, or contributed to the system as part of a school project become the property of the school district on a "one-time use" basis. Ownership of the materials will revert back to the individual or group who created them as a part of a school project once the publishing cycle has ended. After such time, the district may obtain permission from the individual or group to publish the materials again in the future.

Klein ISD Acceptable Use Procedures (cont.)

Internet Web Page Publishing

Publishing Student Work on the Internet: In the course of student projects and classroom activities, students may create original works that warrant publishing on the Internet via a teacher, campus, or district home page. Student work may be “published” on the Internet to be viewed by other users around the world unless the parent objects in writing. In the interest of student safety, name always indicates the first initial and full last name or first name only of the student. Any other student name configuration will require specific parental permission.

Required Disclaimer for Linking to Personal Home Pages: Approved links created by Klein employees or students that reside off Klein servers must contain a link that will automatically prompt the following disclaimer: “You are leaving the KISD web page, thank you for visiting our site.”

Anonymous Materials: No anonymous media will be published on any Klein ISD campus web page.

Photographs: Parents who elect not to have their child’s picture published on the Internet must submit a written request to the campus principal. Employees who elect not to have their pictures published on the Internet must notify their supervisor in writing.

Group photographs of students may be published on the web if no written parental objection is on file. Accompanying text may be published on the web page with students’ first initial and last name or first name only, and in such a manner that readers do not readily match a name to a face or names to faces. Individual photographs of students may be published on the web after obtaining specific parental permission and must adhere to the naming scheme above.

Copyright Issues: All campus and district publishing must strictly adhere to all copyright laws and must obtain in writing the necessary authority to publish any copyrighted materials, including but not limited to photographs, cartoons, logos, sound files, and music files.

Student Work: Authentic writings or artwork can be published with first initials and last names or first name only of students. Any other student name configuration will require specific parental permission. The creators of these authentic writings and artwork will be responsible for the content of these materials and must adhere to all copyright laws. All student-created pages and original works should contain the following disclaimer: This page (or work) was created by and represents the views and opinions of the creator(s). It does not represent the views of, nor does the Klein Independent School District or any of its employees endorse it in any way.

Personal Information: No home addresses, phone numbers or other personal information may appear on student-created pages or works or any official campus page published on any campus or district server.

Accuracy: All electronic publications are expected to meet conventional academic standards of proper spelling, grammar, and accuracy of information.

Klein ISD Tablet PC Guidelines

- ◆ Only a Klein ISD Tablet PC will be permitted for use at school or on the district network.
- ◆ Students may have no expectation of privacy on any information stored on, accessed from, or used with the Tablet PC. The Tablet PC belongs to Klein ISD, and appropriate district and school officials may monitor a computer or access its contents at any time.
- ◆ All students will be issued a Klein ISD backpack with an identification tag. The identification tag **must** remain on the backpack at all times. If the identification tag is lost, the student must immediately notify a teacher or an administrator.
- ◆ If technical issues arise, students must notify a teacher immediately.
- ◆ Each Tablet PC is identified by a specific number and assigned to a student with a school issued backpack. To ensure that a student always has his assigned Tablet PC, Tablet PCs should never be switched from backpack to backpack.
- ◆ Under no circumstances may Tablet PCs be left in unsupervised areas. Unsupervised areas include the school grounds and campus, the cafeteria, locker rooms, library, unlocked classrooms, hallways, and any place outside of school that is not the student’s home. Any computer left in these areas is in danger of being stolen.
- ◆ Unsupervised Tablet PCs will be picked up by staff and taken to the Krimmel Repair Center (KRC). Disciplinary action may be taken for leaving a Tablet PC in an unsupervised location.
- ◆ If a student leaves the Tablet PC at home, or if the battery is not fully charged, the student may be required to complete hand-written assignments.
- ◆ Students are not allowed to change the screensaver at any time.
- ◆ Sound will be muted at all times unless permission is obtained from the instructor and is for instructional purposes only.
- ◆ Files may not be deleted by anyone other than the original creator/ owner. Deletion of certain files can affect the performance of the Tablet PC, and can interfere with the student’s ability to complete class work, which may affect the student’s grades.
- ◆ Music and games other than those used during instruction are not allowed on the Tablet PC. Students may not download or save any music, games, or programs to the Tablet PC. All software must be district provided. Any student who installs personal software on the Tablet PC will be subject to disciplinary action.

Student Responsibilities

- ◆ Students are responsible at all times for their Tablet PC, whether at home or school. Tablet PCs must be stored in the provided backpack when not in use.
- ◆ Students are responsible for bringing their Tablet PC to school every-day.
- ◆ Students are responsible for logging in under their assigned username. Students may not share their password with other individuals.
- ◆ Students are responsible for carrying all Tablet PC components in the Tablet PC backpack at all times.
- ◆ Students should not loan their Tablet PC nor any Tablet PC component to another student for any reason.
- ◆ Students may not play games, load or download any software, music pictures, etc. on the Tablet PC unless instructed by a teacher to do so.
- ◆ Students are responsible for charging and maintaining the battery in their Tablet PC **daily**.
- ◆ Tablet PCs come with standardized software already loaded. This standardized load may not be changed in any way.
- ◆ All students have access to a network drive on which to store data. It is the responsibility of the student to see to it that critical files are backed up regularly on the network drive.
- ◆ All use of the Internet must comply with district guidelines. Log files are maintained on each Tablet PC with a detailed history of all Internet sites accessed. All student files will be reviewed.
- ◆ The power cord must not be plugged in to the Tablet PC while in the backpack. This will cause damage to the Tablet PC.

Parental Responsibilities

- ◆ Parents are responsible for monitoring the student's use of the Tablet PC while at home at all times.
- ◆ Parents are responsible for reviewing the Klein Acceptable Use Policy with their student.
- ◆ Parents are responsible for monitoring their student's activities on the Internet on a regular basis.

Impersonation: Attempts to log on to the Network/Internet or computer resource impersonating any account or user whether employee, student, or guest will result in revocation of the user's access to Network/Internet and/or computer resource, possible discipline measures, and could result in legal action. Klein employees may not allow students use or access to a computer that is logged on using any KISD employee's logon and password.

Other Security Risks: Any user identified as having had access privileges revoked or denied on another computer system may be denied access to the KISD Network/Internet.

E-Mail Accounts

Monitored Use: Electronic mail transmissions and other use of the electronic communications system by students and employees shall not be considered confidential and may be monitored at any time by designated district staff to ensure appropriate use for educational or administrative purposes. All communications and information accessible via the school network are property of Klein ISD and are subject to public information requests.

Electronic Mail Violations: Forgery of electronic mail messages is prohibited. Reading, deleting, copying, or modifying the electronic mail of other users, without their permission, is prohibited.

Disclaimer of Liability: The district shall not be liable for users' inappropriate use of electronic communication resources, users' mistakes or negligence, or costs incurred by users; nor shall it be held liable for non-receipt of communications by district or non-district persons including but not limited to parents, students, vendors, and contractors.

User Responsibilities: Each individual in whose name a system account is issued will be responsible at all times for its proper use. System users may not use another person's account without written permission from authorized technology department personnel. The system may not be used for illegal purposes, in support of illegal activities, or for any other activity prohibited by district procedure or policy.

Student E-Mail: Students are not allowed to access personal/home e-mail on the Klein network. Teachers may allow students access to a district determined e-mail account for class assignments if necessary. The student e-mail solution is a teacher-monitored system that provides safe and secure e-mail for students.

E-Mail Network Etiquette: System users are expected to observe the following network etiquette. Be polite; messages typed in capital letters are the computer equivalent of shouting and are considered rude. Use appropriate language. Swearing, vulgarity, ethnic or racial slurs, and any other inflammatory language are prohibited. Revealing personal addresses or phone numbers of others is prohibited. Students are prohibited from revealing the personal addresses or phone numbers of themselves or others. Using the network in such a way that would disrupt its use by other users is prohibited.

Network/Internet Use

Individual Student Access: Individual **student** access will be through teacher-designed instruction for the sole purpose of the completion of school projects and activities with priority given to those students with required classroom assignments.

Submission of the parent and student signatures on the form in the student handbook certifies that the parents and student understand and will follow Klein ISD Network/Internet policies and procedures.

Inappropriate Use: Inappropriate use includes, but is not limited to, those uses that violate the law, that are specifically named as violations below, that violate the rules of network etiquette, or that hamper the integrity or security of this or any network connected to the Network/Internet.

Commercial Use: Use of technology for commercial purposes, product advertisement, or political lobbying is prohibited. A commercial purpose is defined as offering or providing products or services.

Unsolicited E-Mail: Sending unsolicited junk mail or chain letters is prohibited. Proliferation of jokes, stories, etc. that have no education value is prohibited. These items take up valuable server space and resources. When you receive an item of this kind, delete it and do not send it to anyone else.

Vandalism/Mischief: Vandalism and mischief are prohibited. Vandalism is defined as any deliberate or intentional malicious attempt to harm, modify, or destroy computer hardware, the data or reputation of another user, the Network/Internet, or any networks that are connected to the Network/Internet. This includes, but is not limited to, the creation or propagation of computer viruses and unauthorized access such as “hacking,” installation and/or use of unauthorized software such as games, and any use that is not definable as or in support of official district business and/or curriculum initiatives. Any interference with the work of other users, with or without malicious intent, is construed as mischief and is strictly prohibited.

File/Data Violations: Deleting, examining, copying, or modifying files and/or data belonging to other users, without their permission, is prohibited.

System Interference/Alteration: Deliberate attempts to exceed, evade, or change resource quotas are prohibited. The deliberate causing of network congestion through mass consumption of system resources is prohibited.

Reporting Security Problems: If a user identifies or has knowledge of a security problem on the Network/Internet the user should immediately notify a teacher, administrator, or the system administrator. The security problem should not be shared with any others.

Inadvertence: It is understood that inappropriate sites may be accidentally encountered through no malicious intent. If a system user accidentally enters an inappropriate site, the system user is to immediately back out of the site and notify the teacher/administrator. The teacher/administrator will notify the network administrator to request the site blocked from future access.

Students are responsible for the general care of the Tablet PC. It is in the student’s best interest to take great care of the Tablet PC since the same Tablet PC will be reissued each year. Tablet PCs that are broken or fail to work properly must be taken to the KRC (Krimmel Repair Center). Please follow these precautions:

- ◆ Never leave the Tablet PC unattended.
- ◆ Do not place food and/or liquids near the Tablet PC.
- ◆ Do not stack heavy objects on top of the Tablet PC.
- ◆ **Never** attempt to repair or reconfigure the Tablet PC or any of the peripherals.
- ◆ Do not write, draw, stick or adhere anything to the Tablet PC.
- ◆ Do not personalize the backpack or the Tablet PC using markers, stickers, etc.
- ◆ Keep the Tablet PC and other electronic storage media away from electromagnetic fields, which can erase or corrupt your data.
- ◆ Do not expose the Tablet PC to direct sunlight, extreme temperatures, or ultraviolet light for extended periods of time.
- ◆ Do not leave the Tablet PC in any vehicle!
- ◆ Do not obstruct the Tablet PC’s vents, and do not place the Tablet PC on surfaces such as paper or carpet while it is turned on.
- ◆ Do not carry the Tablet PC while the screen is open.
- ◆ Tablet PCs are not to be used on Klein buses.
- ◆ When walking from class to class, the Tablet PC must be properly closed and stored in the backpack.

Selected Klein ISD Acceptable Use Procedures for the Network/Internet

(the entire Klein Acceptable Use Procedure can be found in the Student Handbook)

Care of the Tablet PC (cont.)

Screen Care

The Tablet PC screen is particularly sensitive to excessive pressure. In order to convert the Tablet PC into a writing tablet, the screen must be rotated. The screen must *only* be rotated in a **clockwise** direction. Extreme care must be taken to protect the screen from accidental damage.

- ◆ Do not place anything on top of the Tablet PC or lean on it when it is closed.
- ◆ Do not place anything in the backpack that may press against the cover of the Tablet PC.
- ◆ Do not poke the screen with anything. The stylus is the only device that should be used to interact with the Tablet PC.
- ◆ Do not place anything on the keyboard before closing the lid (e.g., pens, pencils, etc.)

Internet Access from Home

In order to access the Internet from home:

1. You must have an Internet service provider.
2. Using an Ethernet cable, the Tablet PC can be “hardwired” to a switch, hub, or router.
3. If you have an existing wireless access point, the Tablet PC can join your wireless network.

Please note that the Krimmel Repair Center will not be able to troubleshoot home connection issues. Please contact your Internet Service Provider for help.

The Internet consists of millions of computer users in nearly every country on the globe connected through thousands of computer servers located at universities, governmental institutions, private companies, networking organizations and countless other organizations throughout the world. Electronic information research skills are now fundamental to preparation of citizens and future employees. The Klein Independent School District is connected to the worldwide electronic communication system called the Internet and the district home page has been published at www.kleinisd.net and will be periodically updated to keep the information current.

The Internet represents a unique opportunity for our students and staff to begin to explore the incredible wealth of information that will enhance their learning. The Internet makes accessible some resources that are not appropriate for all audiences. As educators, we know the benefits support judicious use. Klein ISD will take reasonable steps to preclude access to material we would not want our students to investigate; however, it is not possible for the KISD to preclude all possibility of inappropriate access. The district utilizes an Internet filtering system that is designed to restrict access to materials that are harmful to minors and not appropriate or educationally sound. The filtering is always activated during student use.

The KISD expects that teachers will blend thoughtful use of the Internet throughout the curriculum and will provide guidance and instruction to students in its use at all times that students utilize the Internet. The KISD also expects the prudent exercise of good judgment by Klein administration, support staff, and teachers while using the Internet and associated e-mail as tools in the day-to-day administration of their employment with the Klein ISD and in the classroom environment.

As much as possible, access from school to Internet resources will be structured in ways which point students to those resources which have been evaluated prior to use. While students will be able to move beyond those resources to others that have not been previewed by staff, they shall be provided with guidelines and lists of resources particularly suited to learning objectives.

All **student** Internet access will be through teacher-led instruction for the sole purpose of the completion of school projects.

To ensure responsible use of the Network/Internet, all students and staff who use the Network/Internet will be required to adhere to the Klein Acceptable Use Procedures for the Network/Internet and all school board policies and administrative directives. Inappropriate use will result in disciplinary action that could include the loss of access to the Network/Internet. Since the user is also subject to the laws of Texas Penal Code, Chapter 33.02 (Computer Crime Offenses), violations could result in legal action.

Klein ISD makes no warranties of any kind, whether expressed or implied, for the service it is providing. Klein ISD will not be responsible for any damages you suffer. This includes loss of data resulting from delays, non-deliveries, missed deliveries, or service interruptions caused by its own negligence or your errors or omissions. Use of any information obtained via the Internet is at your own risk. Klein ISD specifically denies any responsibility for the accuracy or quality of information obtained through its services.

Terms of Klein ISD Tablet PC Use

Acceptable Use: Each student will comply at all times with the Klein ISD Acceptable Use Policy, and the guidelines outlined in the Tablet PC Handbook. Any failure to comply will result in disciplinary action and could end the rights of possession effective immediately.

Liability: If the Tablet PC is accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, the parent/guardian may be responsible for the reasonable cost of repair or the replacement value on the date of the loss **if the Optional Accidental Damage and Protection Coverage is not purchased** and in other instances outlined in this handbook. In the case of theft, the parent/guardian must immediately notify school administration. If the Tablet PC is lost or damaged due to negligence, the parent/guardian will be responsible for the reasonable cost of replacement. Tablet PCs not returned, for any reason, at the end of the school year or when a student withdraws will be considered stolen.

Repossession: If the student and/or parent/guardian does not timely and fully comply with all terms of this agreement, Klein ISD has the right to come to you to pick up the property at any time.

Scheduled Evaluations: Each laptop will be evaluated twice a year to verify condition and compliance with district policy. These scheduled evaluations will occur in the fall and spring respectively. Additionally, random checks will occur throughout the school year.

Repair Down-time

Klein ISD is committed to student use of technology to aid academic success. When a student's Tablet PC is being repaired, there are several options available for continued use of technology.

- ◆ **Network Student Folders**

All students have a network folder in which to store digital files. Students can save important work in this folder, and access their work from any computer on the network.

- ◆ **Classroom Computers**

Each classroom has desktop computers that are available for student use.

- ◆ **Loaner Tablet PCs**

If a student's Tablet PC is damaged, it will be repaired as quickly as possible. If available, a loaner Tablet PC will be issued. The policies outlined in this handbook also apply to loaner Tablet PCs.

**A loaner will not be provided if the damage is determined to be purposeful.

Security

Various security measures are used on Klein ISD computers. Security measures are not only used to protect Klein ISD assets, but measures are also taken to protect Klein ISD students. Two primary forms of security exist:

1. **Computer Security**

Security is in place on each system to prevent certain activities. These include, but are not limited to, downloading, installing software, removing software, and changing system settings.

2. **Filtering Software**

Internet filtering software automatically filters all access to the Internet. While at home Internet content will continue to be filtered while students are using their Klein ISD Tablet PC. Since no filtering software can filter 100% of improper content, parents are responsible for monitoring their child's access to the Internet when the student is at home.

Repair Cost Information

Each Krimmel Intermediate student will be issued a Tablet PC. All Tablet PCs are covered by a factory warranty for the entire year that covers all manufacturer's defects. The Tablet PCs are in good working order, and are issued with standardized software loaded. Students are expected to keep the Tablet PC in good condition. Failure to do so could result in out-of-pocket costs summarized in the table on the following page.

All monies owed must be paid in full before a Tablet PC will be reissued. Report card holds will apply to all Tablet PC monies owed.

Accidental Damage and Protection Coverage (ADPC):

This coverage may be purchased through the school for \$70.00 (*non-refundable*) per year by the parent/guardian. This coverage is payable in one lump sum prior to the distribution of the Tablet PC, or in special cases, paid by semester or monthly installments as determined by the principal. The coverage includes three incidents of accidental loss and/or damage per year. **It does not cover loss or damage due to negligence.**

Tablet PC Security Deposit:

(Required for all, unless the Accidental Damage and Protection Coverage is purchased.)

An annual \$200 Tablet PC Security Deposit is required for all students whose parent/guardian chooses not to purchase the Accidental Damage and Protection Coverage. The \$200 Tablet PC Security Deposit is **fully refundable** at the end of the school year (or when a student checks out of school) **when the Tablet PC is returned to Klein ISD in acceptable working order.** The \$200 Tablet PC Security Deposit will be applied to all outstanding charges for repair of the Tablet PC. In the event charges exceed \$200, the parent/guardian will be responsible for the entire repair charge. The full amount of the \$200 Tablet PC Security Deposit is due prior to the distribution of the Tablet PC.

The required \$200 Tablet PC Security Deposit is waived if a parent/guardian opts to purchase the \$70.00 non-refundable Accidental Damage and Protection Coverage.

The condition of all Tablet PCs will be checked throughout the year. Students are responsible for any unreported damage.

The table* on the following page represents charges for each occurrence of loss or damage.
